ST. VALENTINE'S DAY:

St. Valentine was a kindly priest who lived in Rome in the early days of Christianity. He had a special sympathy for young people who loved each other. Soldiers in the Roman army were forbidden to marry, but Valentine would sometimes secretly marry them. He was also very fond of the flowers he grew in his garden.

Because he was Christian, Valentine was arrested and thrown into a prison. When the children of his neighborhood learned this, they gathered flowers in his garden and threw them through the window into the cell where St. Valentine was kept.

The memory of St. Valentine began to be celebrated on the day of a much older Roman feast when there was a lot of dancing and partners were chosen by drawing lots.

IS GOD THE FIRST "LINE ITEM" IN YOUR BUDGET?

Each month, Orthodox Christians who practice good stewardship sit down with their budget to put aside saving for their future and pay expenses that are due, such as housing, automobiles, and groceries, etc..

However, giving to God through their parish comes first on their list of obligations.

As stewards of our Church, **we are obliged to give back to God the "first fruits" of our labors.** Indeed all that we are, and all that we have, comes from God. Through sacrificial giving, we acknowledge and give thanks for what we have received.

Giving back to God a portion of our income and assets is **only one fundamental aspect of being a Christian steward.** As stewards, we should also:

***Pray** to God with grateful hearts, read scripture and **participate in the Eucharist** and other sacraments

***Nurture** our family with time and love. The home is the domestic church, where we are to nurture relationships, offer forgiveness and reconciliation, **and share our Christ-centered values** – especially when pressured to conform to an oftentimes hostile, secular society.

***Share ourselves with our parish. Our talents and skills are meant to be cultivated and shared. We are obliged to share ourselves with our parish family – and beyond.**

As stewards of God's gifts and members of the Church, we are called to be disciples of Jesus Christ. Disciples experience conversion, or *life-sharing changes of mind and heart, and commit themselves to the Lord.* Mature disciples consciously decided to follow Christ, no matter what the cost.
