SS. PETER & PAUL FAST- starts tomorrow, Monday, June 12th to June 28th. This is one of 4 fasts that the Orthodox Church follows each year. Please observe it to the best of your ability.

Saint Peter traditionally is regarded as the leader of the Twelve Disciples of Jesus. He was closely connected with the early life and ministry of our Lord. After the death of Jesus, Peter sought to preserve the spiritual gift left by Jesus to His followers. In the course of his missionary journeys, Peter founded the Church in Antioch.

Saint Paul is the greatest of missionaries. The marvelous story of his conversion on the Damascus Road (Acts 9:1-22) is hardly more striking than the rest of his life, one of the great adventure stories of history.

The account of *Paul's* missionary journeys and the letters he wrote to the Churches he founded form an important part of the New Testament. He traveled over vast areas of the Roman world, preaching Christ, and fashioning the Christian Faith for all time. He called himself an Apostle. He was the greatest of them, even though he was not of the original Twelve Disciples.

St. Paul was martyred in Rome during the reign of the Emperor Nero, about 67 A.D. He was one of the most influential men in the history of the human race, for his ideas, like those of Jesus, have affected man's thinking for nearly two thousand years. Almost half of the 27 books of the New Testament were written by St. Paul. The writings of St. Paul have changed the course of human civilization. Many theologians and historians agree that, with the exception of Jesus Christ Himself, no other man in the history of the Christian Church has done more for the Faith than St. Paul. He is truly "The Pillar" of the Church of Christ on earth.
